(continued) is another way the Kiwanis Club of Lakewood is working in support of children in the community through Young Children Priority One, (YCPO).

PROJECT EVALUATION

Data from registration forms and sign-in sheets will be compiled based on adult participant-parent or caregiver, children by age, families represented, drop-in programs attended and frequency, participant's school neighborhood, duration of Lakewood residency and participation in other early care and education activities to verify targeted population is reached.

Parents/caregivers will be surveyed to determine opportunities for literacy skill development/enhancement, comfort level of literacy based interaction with children, literacy experiences both in-home and community-based, awareness and frequency of access to community resources.

Learn Through Play program staff will be surveyed to provide anecdotal data regarding the accomplishment of project goals and objectives. Such report will address all project procedures and activities including but not limited to recruitment (families/volunteers), registration, training (volunteers), publicity and literacy activities.

Information obtained will be reviewed and summarized by the Program Manager to further support the accomplishment of all project goals and objectives. The final evaluation report will be forwarded to the Ohio District Kiwanis Foundation, the Kiwanis Club of Lakewood, Lakewood City Schools and Harrison Elementary.

With this Evaluation we conclude this series. However, it is just the beginning for Kiwanis. As Lakewood Kiwanis has taken on this project, we have agreed to support it not only financially but with our community service time as well. Lakewood Kiwanians take note of how you might be personally involved.

Help is also needed on Friday at any time when the packaging of food takes place.

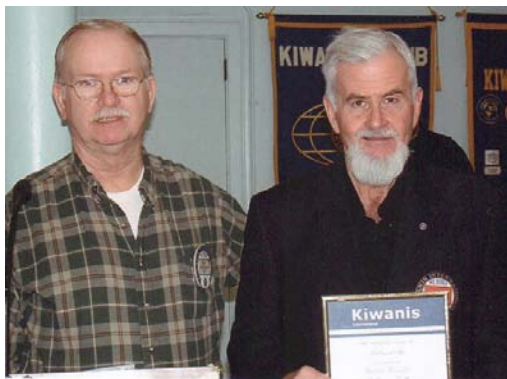
